Closed Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, public holidays, Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve

Recycle free of charge (Nillumbik residents only):

- batteries – household, mobile phone and car
- cardboard (excluding waxed cardboard)
- e-waste (any item with a plug, cord or battery) e.g. household appliances*, electronic tools, televisions, phones, computers and accessories
- light globes/bulbs and fluoro tubes
- motor oil
- scrap metal* e.g. bike, stove, washing machine, dryer, metal poles and roofing
- VHS tapes
- CDs, DVDs and cassettes (including covers)
- x-rays

* Charges apply for fridges, freezers and air conditioners because of the degassing process

Charges apply for:

- fridges, freezers and air conditioners
- garden materials (use your green waste voucher on your rates notice)
- mattresses
- broken furniture
- plaster
- polystyrene/foam/bean bag beans
- tyres and rims
- wood e.g. treated pine, fence palings, untreated timber
- other accepted items that can't be recycled



Booked Hard Waste Collection


Your collection week is

Place items on the nature strip close to your property line on the weekend immediately before your collection week.

Do not put out items before the Saturday or without making a booking, otherwise you could be fined under the Environmental Protection Act. For more information call **9433 3512**.

- ✔ Hard waste must be placed in neat piles.
- ✔ All items must be able to be lifted to shoulder height by two people. Maximum length of an item is 1.5 metres.
- ✔ Place out items with the orange 'BOOKED' sticker clearly displayed and visible from the road.
- ✔ Maximum 2 cubic metres of hard waste will be collected. Materials over 2 cubic metres **WILL NOT** be collected.
- ✔ Residents are responsible for removing any material not collected by the contractor within 24 hours of collection.

Example of 2 cubic metres of hard waste




What will be collected



Carpet rolled and tied. Maximum of one roll which must be no longer than 1.5 metres and able to be safely lifted by two people



Up to 10 pieces of timber neatly tied and not exceeding 1.5 metres in length



Mattress/mattress base (max 2). Note, a mattress and base or 2 mattresses is equivalent to 2 cubic metres




Household furniture



Sheet glass/mirror wrapped in several layers of strong paper and taped. This must be marked 'GLASS'



Electronic waste e.g. TVs, computers, fridges with doors removed, stoves, washing machines and vacuum cleaners including battery operated devices




Empty and clean paint tins, scrap iron and other waste metal



Tools, mowers and small car parts



What will not be collected




No fence panels, renovation material, building waste or cement sheeting. No commercial or industrial waste



No bricks, concrete, stone, clay, sand or soil



No liquids, including paint, motor oil, garden sprays and chemicals



No tyres, lighting, solar panels or batteries



No household garbage or recycling



No garden materials



No bean bags, polystyrene or foam



No gas bottles



No human waste, other bio-hazardous materials or hazardous waste



These items are recovered and recycled. The remaining material is shredded and passed through magnets to recover more metal for recycling
